

Here's what some of the 180 elected Greens elsewhere in England have done:

- Brought 800 empty houses back into use for local people in Brighton

- Greens in Lambeth managed to introduce a series of road improvements to improve accident rates near schools
- In Lancaster, Green Councillors introduced a solar farm that is set to net the Council £4m
- Bristol Greens introduced a social care precept that raised £3.5million for vulnerable people



We will...

We will **protect** all trees on **public land**. We will introduce 20 mph speed limits in **residential areas**.

In the latest edition of the Oxford Junior Dictionary the words 'acorn' and 'bluebell' were removed and the words 'wifi' and 'broadband' added.
